Volunteer of the month: Searching for a cure

In 1987, IBMer Jeffry Ullman and his wife Ellen became first–time parents when Zachary came into the world. At fifteen months — after consultations with their pediatrician about Zachary's insatiable thirst, excessive urination and an emergency room visit — doctors confirmed that their son had type 1 diabetes.

Since Zachary's initial diagnosis, Ullman has become a tireless champion for finding a cure through his work at the <u>Diabetes</u> Research Institute Foundation, (DRIF) as well as an advocate for On Demand Community tools.

A smarter approach to volunteering

Since 1990, Ullman's volunteer advocacy activities with DRIF have included participation as the Foundation's Community Outreach Chair, utilization of the On Demand Community's <u>Technology planning solution</u> and a tenacious use of IBM's Community Grants

program.

"IBM's Community Grants is a great program, and I am quite proud of IBM for making it available to employees and retirees," says Ullman. "It is straightforward, easy—to—use and provides for critical IT resources for schools and nonprofit organizations. I've been fortunate to use it 14 times to obtain grants for DRIF." Ullman estimates the total value of the grants to be approximately \$15,000.

The impact Ullman has made on DRIF by leveraging On Demand Community tools and resources is immense. "The technology planning that Jeffry assisted us with, as well the IBM Community Grant donations of desktop PCs, ThinkPads and printers, has enabled us to spend more money on research—related activities instead of diverting these monies for necessary office equipment," says Foundation President and CEO, Robert A. Pearlman.


